SUSR TRAINING PROGRAMME

- UPDATE
 Face to face training package developed for Chairs, Reviewers and Panel members, with supplementary e-Learning in development for Panel members.
- First pilot sessions for Chairs, Reviewers and Panel members to be delivered in February with full training scheduled for delivery from April to September.
- Monitoring and evaluation system being developed to track effectiveness of training
- Training Steering Group members working to strengthen CSP links within training development and delivery.

SUSR BACKGROUND

Create a single review process where a multiagency approach is required, incorporating the following review processes Adult Practice **Review; Child Practice Review**; Domestic Homicide Review: Mental Health Homicide Review; Offensive Weapon Homicide Review. The final report is then used to inform professional practice via the Wales Safeguarding Repository.

 The Victim and Family Reference Group met on the 30th November to progress the Engagement Plan. Comments are due back on the initial draft by 18th December after which a revised version will be produced for further consideration.

LEARNING FROM OTHERS

- Melbourne University, Australia recently published a brief <u>report</u> on the experiences of children and young people bereaved due to parental intimate partner homicide.
- Manchester Metropolitan University's HALT project has published four thematic research <u>papers</u> for the Domestic Abuse Commissioner (DAC) on DHR recommendations: These looked into themes across Criminal justice; Physical and mental health; Children's services; Adult Social Care.
